5. Matters Arising

5.1Track to summit. John Fitch initial cut all the way up in Whakaraupo Reserve. Warner has cut to fence in Steadfast. Paul reports that Council will proceed with further work on the whole track this month and will use a summer work labour. To be completed by Christmas.
